Bidding for the Linguistic Landscapes Workshop: Some guidelines

Since its inception in Tel Aviv in 2008, the Linguistic Landscape Workshops have been organized in a variety of locations around the world and without a steering committee. The planning and organization of the conferences are entirely in the hands of the respective convenors.

Anyone interested in bidding to host the next Linguistic Landscapes Workshop should alert the current convenor at least one year in advance to secure a spot in the next available business meeting.

Bids are made in the form of a short presentation during the current conference's business meeting, open to all current delegates. Bids should include:

- 1. a proposed theme for the conference;
- 2. tentative dates if possible;
- 3. information about the host institution and convenor/organizers;
- 4. information about the destination, including how to get there;
- 5. estimated costs for participants and/or (partial) sponsorship opportunities;
- 6. any other relevant information.

All conference delegates present at the business meeting will be asked to approve any bids. When there is more than one bid for a particular year, all participants present at the meeting shall decide by means of a vote. Exceptionally, participants may also decide on more than one workshop in subsequent years.
